LAFAYETTE TRAIL HISTORIC MARKER PLACED AT THE SUFFOLK VISITOR CENTER

SUFFOLK, VA (November 30, 2020): Suffolk has been recognized as an official stop along The Lafayette Trail which highlights locations the Marquis de Lafayette visited during his farewell tour of America in 1824 and 1825. Suffolk is the first marker in Virginia to be installed. The commemorative marker is located at the Suffolk Visitor Center, the site of the Nansemond County Courthouse, where the townspeople hosted a grand banquet celebrating General Lafayette's visit to Suffolk on February 25, 1825. The Castle Inn, which was located a short distance from the courthouse, was selected for the General's overnight accommodations. The historic marker will be unveiled on Thursday, December 3, 2020, at 2:00 p.m. The Suffolk Visitor Center is located at 524 North Main Street in downtown historic Suffolk, Virginia.
